How are we to evaluate the issue of abortion?

Abortion is one of those issues that is dividing not only the United States but the world. There are those to are adamant that it is a perfectly legitimate option for women who find themselves pregnant without wanting to have a child.

1. What biblical arguments are given to support the issue of abortion? Exodus **21:22**

The primary text used to support abortion is translated by the NAS to say "... so that she has a miscarriage, yet there is no further injury ...". It is understood by the proponents of abortion that since she had a miscarriage and yet it is described as there being no harm following. This is used to imply that a miscarriage caused by another (in the midst of a fight) is a situation in which no harm took place. There are a couple of problems with this. The basic issue is that the word is translated miscarriage literally means "her child departs from her" and the phrase "no further injury" literally means "no injury". The word "further" was inserted by the translators. The real situation is that a type of premature birth took place and both mother and child are fine.
