Is the conscience a safe guide?

Many people state that in order to do what is right, you just need to listen to your conscience and you will never go wrong.

1. What is the most common understanding of listening to one's conscience?

Deuteronomy **12:8** Judges 17:6; 21:25

Proverbs 21:2

When most people talk about following or listening to one's own conscience, they are referring to doing what they believe to be right. It is their own feelings and own impressions of that which is right, wrong, true, or false that informs the decisions that they make. In essence, they trust in themselves and in their own understanding of things.
