Other verses indicate that the soul is the origins of a living entity while the spirit is that which truly gives the soul life and purpose. The soul seems to be associated with the purpose of life itself. In the Law delivered by Moses, it is often the soul that is cut off. While it may be associated with a removal of the person from the congregation of God's people, it carries with it a deeper meaning of the cessation of true life. The soul is associated with the grave and eternal condemnation or hell. The battle that we face has to do with the ramifications to the eternity of the soul.

It is the spirit of God that has grief over man's sinfulness. It is also the spirit that is troubled when sin is present. This would be similar in concept to the work of the conscience. Likewise it is the spirit that is energized in the presence of good news. It is the spirit that guides the actions of a man. It is the spirit that follows after God or follows after its own pursuits. The spirit of a man needs to be controlled but the man has no real power to keep it around to avoid death. It is the humble or contrite spirit that pleases God. It is the spirit of a man that God will replace with His spirit in the work of redemption. When God gives his spirit to a person, no one receives just a bit of His spirit but the fulness of it. Ultimately it is the spirit that gives life, when it is God's spirit. Even the evil spirits (demons) know who are the believers and who are the unbelievers. It is the spirit that is the ultimate teacher of the things of God. The spirit of God dwells inside the believer. Within each believer, there is a battle of the natural spirit and God's indwelling (transplanted) spirit. A message that is identified as having come from the spirit needs to be tested.
